Sweets

A gentle reminder about sweets and birthday treats!

Pupils are not permitted to bring sweets into school at all. This is in lunch bags but also when it is their birthday. Although it is very kind to share with peers, last year staff took this decision for a number of reasons.

We try to promote a healthy eating approach and realised that some weeks there were 2-4 birthdays in a class so children were taking endless treats home and therefore a high consumption of sugar. We were made aware that many families had gone sugar-free so to remain healthier and inclusive we explored changing the rules!

We have a number of children with health issues and allergies who cannot eat all food products and it is potentially dangerous for them to consume foods their parents have not approved. Therefore, we cannot permit handing out of any foods in school.

Finally, the treats were becoming very competitive and grand and many parents were feeling pressure to spend a lot of money on birthday treats for the class when they had many, more important, financial commitments. It was reported that a child had commented on someone's sweets being 'cheap' and we never want any parent or pupil to feel their treats are not good enough. We are striving for a fair society. We thank you in advance for your support in this and trust you will support us by not permitting your child to bring sweets into school.

On a birthday, each child receives a 'dojo' and the class sing Happy Birthday to them. They also get the chance to wear the class badge which is a lovely way to show the whole school it is their special day.

We will continue to have 'cake sales' as a way to raise money for charity and also allow sweets at special events such as disco, cinema and panto. For each of these, we check all children can consume the sweets to ensure it fits with individual health care plans. All in all, a safer, healthier and more equal approach!

Dogs

We do not permit dogs on school property.

We have displayed notices on the school gates but would like to make parents and also grandparents aware that unless the dig is a guide dog or approved therapy dog, they will need to be tied up at the main gates.



Parking


If you make arrangements for another person to collect your child, please inform them of this rule.

Feeling the pinch this January? You're not alone.

Half the population start the year in the red. Christmas and New Year spending is just one of the reasons that we often start the year overdrawn and in debt. There has been pressure to buy the kids the latest toys and go overboard with all the trimmings. Most of us also end up spending more than we can afford on food and drink over the festive season. But saving just a little each week or month throughout the year can make a big difference and add up to a tidy sum by the end of the year. But maybe you're not sure how to go about this?

Among the services on offer at BCU are ways to allocate money for regular bills, ways to save just a little every month, a pre-paid Visa card and a range of affordable loans at fair interest rates. Your money is completely safe in the Berkshire Credit Union too, as like banks, it is fully regulated by the Bank of England, the Financial Conduct Authority and the Prudential Regulation Au-thority.
