

Foreword

Welcome to St Joseph's 'Our Prayer' booklet – we hope that you will enjoy praying with your children at home as much as we do within our school community.

We believe that prayer is a shared experience, a conversation with God that we all have our own way of 'talking and listening to God'. There is no 'right' way to pray.

We believe that the traditional prayers that are said regularly in our school parish community are important to pass on to our children.

Please help your child to become familiar with them and enjoy the experience of praying together at home.

Spontaneous Prayers

In addition to the traditional prayers that we say in school, we use everyday situations to 'talk to God'. For example, during the day we encourage children to say thank you to God. Thank you God for a lovely day, thank you God for my family, thank you God for......

Night prayer is very important too. The close of the day is an opportunity to share a quiet time with your child/children and to thank God for the gifts or challenges of the day.

Praying with calming music is a relaxing way to pray together at the end of the day. Maybe you could have a 'prayer bowl' with prayer ideas in it or make a 'prayer dice'. There are lots of fun ways to pray as a family.

We hope you enjoy the experience of praying with your child.

Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit, that I love but what is holy.


Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit, to defend all that is holy.

The Prayer of St Richard of Chichester


Thanks be to you, our Lord Jesus Christ,

Pope Francis' Five Finger Prayer

The next finger is the index. Pray for those who teach you, instruct you, and heal you. They need the support and wisdom to show direction to others. Always keep them in your prayers.

The thumb is the closest finger to you, so start praying for those who are closest to you. They are the persons easiest to remember. To pray for our dear ones is a "Sweet Obligation."

The center finger is the tallest. It reminds us of our leaders, the governors, and those who have authority. They need God's guidance.

The fourth finger is the ring finger. Even though it may surprise you, it is our weakest finger. It should remind us to pray for the weakest, the sick, or those plagued by problems. They need your prayers.

And finally we have our smallest finger, the pinkie. Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. When you are done praying for the other four groups, you will be able to see your own needs in the proper perspective and be able to pray for yourself in a better way.
